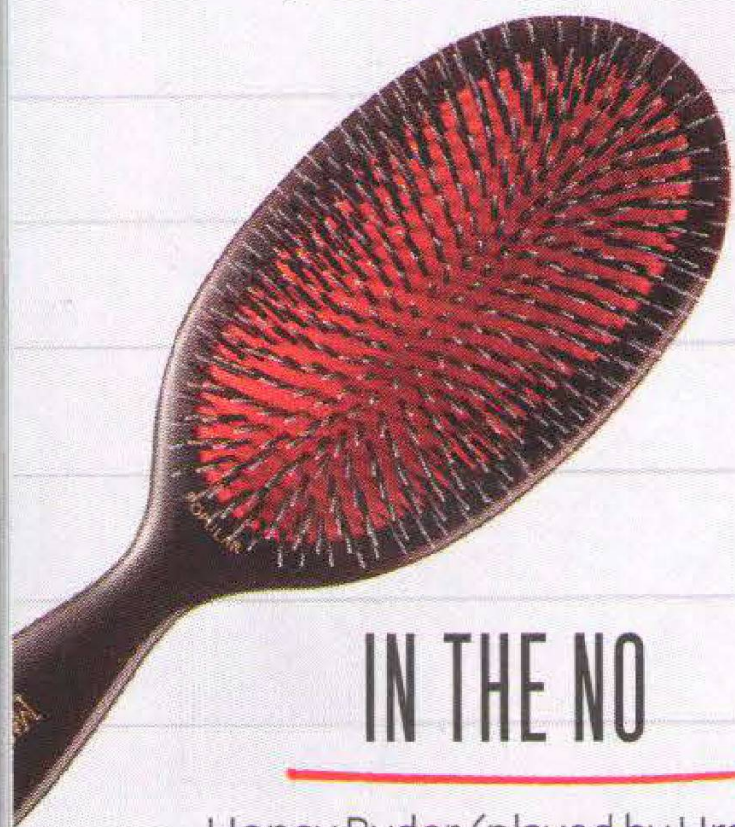

BEACHY BOMBSHELL

She may live in Jamaica, but there's no Monica from *Friends*-style Caribbean frizz going on here. Having officially made wet-look hair a 'thing', Honey's signature look when on dry land is a tumble of soft waves with that classic 60s height at the crown. 'I always think of this look as super-sexy with a touch of vamp,' says hairstylist Louis Byrne. 'It has a retro feel, but it's totally possible to bring it up-to-date without straying too far away.' Byrne suggests spritzing a thickening spray onto damp hair before blow-drying upside down with a bristle brush. Once dry, section your hair, fashion into barrel rolls and pin to add volume and texture. Leave to cool, brush out and gently backcomb the crown, finishing with a spritz of texture spray for hold.
